Bath Richfield Kiwanis Service Projects

April was a busy month for our service in the community, thanks to the leadership of Jeff Sprongl, our Service Committee chair! We made a visit to Shelter Care Street Outreach Service Center. This program addresses the needs of runaway, homeless and street youth and their families in the community by providing outreach services that promote safety, well-being, self-sufficiency and permanent connections with caring adults. This program not only helps youth leave the streets, but also assists them in moving and adjusting to a safe and appropriate living arrangement. Our club purchased supplies for 30 snack bags and 30 personal hygiene bags for their clients that drop in. Members filled the bags and Jerry Baley delivered them.



We also completed an Essential Needs laundry bag build for the Hope and Healing Center (Battered Women's Shelter). These bags contain personal hygiene items needed for the women coming into the program for emergency.



About 20 Kiwanians and their families contributed to Mayor Wheeler's initiative with Rise Against Hunger to pack 120,000 meals to help combat hunger. Rice, soy, freeze dried vegetables and vitamin packs were combined together to provide nutritious meal pouches to be shipped to needy families abroad. It was great fun to work together with so many community members!
